ABI Students Make a Lasting Impact in Peru

This June, a group of dedicated Year 12 students set off on an unforgettable journey to Peru as part of a service-learning programme coordinated by the FutureSense Foundation and Challenges Abroad. More than just a typical school trip, this immersive experience was rooted in the principles of Catholic Social Teaching, aiming to foster global citizenship, community solidarity and transformative education.

The heart of the trip lay in the students' hands-on work with local schools in the Sacred Valley region. Divided into small teams, the students spent their days supporting educational initiatives designed to teach primary school pupils the importance of health and hygiene. From teaching basic English, to running creative workshops and sports activities, their presence brought energy, encouragement, and much-needed support to the pupils.

Throughout the programme, the group engaged with key principles of Catholic Social Teaching—particularly the dignity of the human person and the call to community; students committed themselves to service that respected the cultural identity and lived experience of the Peruvian people. Alongside teaching, our students planted vegetables in the school garden and painted social areas, designing murals to support their teaching and leave a lasting impression in after their work had been done.





Students also took part in reflection sessions, considering how their actions aligned with the Gospel values of justice, peace, and stewardship. These daily reflections helped turn their experiences into lessons for life, challenging them to return home as agents of change within their own communities.

Alongside the hard work, students also had the opportunity to witness Peru's breath taking landscapes and rich cultural heritage. The trip included time to explore Machu Picchu, the iconic Incan citadel nestled high in the Andes, which left many students in awe of both nature and history. They also visited Cusco, the former capital of the Inca Empire, and experienced traditional Andean culture through local cuisine, music, and markets.



By the end of the two-week journey, the students returned not only with memories and photographs but with a renewed sense of purpose and a global perspective. The partnership with the FutureSense Foundation and Challenges Abroad had provided a platform for meaningful contribution while encouraging personal growth, empathy and leadership.

The Peru programme is a testament to the power of faith in action, education through experience, and the enduring importance of human connection in our global family.
